Have you ever watched a river of rainwater run down your driveway into the lake or storm sewer? Or even worse, seep into your basement? Collecting roof runoff in rain barrels is a good solution to these problems and it also helps alleviate stressed water systems and conserve limited resources.

Features to Consider When Buying or Making a Rainbarrel

Removable lid or opening—for cleaning inside the barrel

1.5 inch diameter over-

flow—attach sump-pump hose and direct to a second rain barrel or to an appropriate site away from the foundation (Note: 3/4-inch garden hose overflow is often used, but will not accommodate heavy rain events.)



Filter-to keep out debris and mosquitoes
