<p>Captain Tim Heroff on Intelligent-Led Policing</p>	<p>Background on Captain Heroff: He has worked in all different areas of the Police Department. He is currently working on Intelligence-Led Policing and enjoys this proactive approach to crime versus the traditional reactive approach.</p> <p>What Intelligent-Led Policing does is it uses objective data to get much more information together on the most high (repeating) offenders. In the last two years there has been better managing and sharing of information between different groups/departments.</p> <p>Intelligent-Led Policing basically does identity resolution of who is this person, who is associated with that person, and what they are associated with (what crimes, criminal activity).</p> <p>The program being used is InfoSphere Identity Insight (ISII). This program was originally used in Las Vegas for catching people doing illegal gambling. It was modified and has been used in the CIA, FBI, Interpol, New York Police Department, and Toronto Police Department. There are more phases to come with this program, such as adding scoring to help figure out the more serious issues/cases and how dangerous certain people may be (have a background report available for the cops right away on if they are known to carry weapons or have weapons violations, etc.).</p>	
<p>FEMA Grant</p>	<p>FEMA is offering a \$35,000 grant opportunity to strengthen community resiliency. RNeighbors, Mayo Clinic and Ken Jones are involved in a local effort to secure one of these grants; application was submitted on October 26. In November the grant winners will be notified. This grant was written to train neighborhoods on how to work together when a disaster occurs.</p> <p>If the grant is approved, CAPS role would be to help facilitate participants in the program.</p>
