  - Projects are designed to vertically expand

### Drafts of updates to the Rochester Zoning Ordinance and Land Development Manual

Including onsite public notice signs and neighborhood informational meetings

- Heard before the Planning and Zoning Commission, August 12, Voted down
  - o Timing of neighborhood meetings proposed to hold before submitting to P&Z (failed)
  - Signage on site (approved)
- To be heard at City Council, September 9
  - Strategy discussion
    - Focus on one aspect of the ordinance at this time: early neighborhood notification
    - Engage City Council prior to the September 9<sup>th</sup> meeting
      - Aligns with strategic goal established at June MCN meeting:
         "Continue to establish good conversations and relationships with city staff and leadership"
      - Mini focus groups (2-4 neighborhood leaders per ward meet with each Council member)
      - Not confrontational, should be conversational
      - Goal: To collect information to bring back to the MCN group and share why early neighborhood notification is important to Rochester neighborhoods.
      - Each meeting have similar talking points and questions
        - o How do you see neighborhood involvement being constructive?
        - o How can we help you get constituent feedback? (so meetings don't go until 2 am)
        - o What are concerns you have?
        - o How can we partner with you?
    - René will help pull together concise information about the topic, collect opinions on talking points and disseminate to the group
